Topic Title: What a load of Rubbish! Reception Spring 1





Skills Taught:

- Use talk to help work out problems and organise thinking and activities, and to explain how things work and why they might happen. (C&L)
- Connect one idea or action to another using a range of connectives. (C&L)
- Understand the effect of changing seasons on the natural world around them. (UTW)
- Know some similarities and differences between things in the past and now, drawing on their experiences and what has been read in class. (UTW)
