Volunteer Week

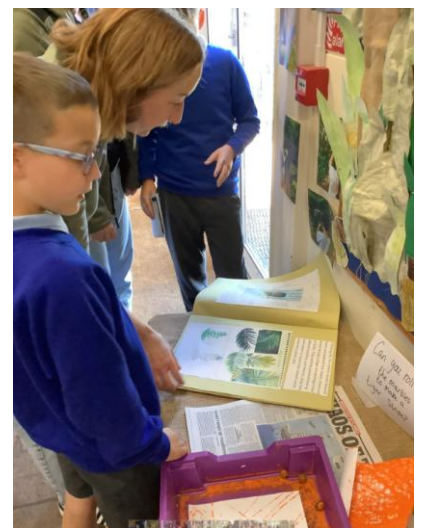
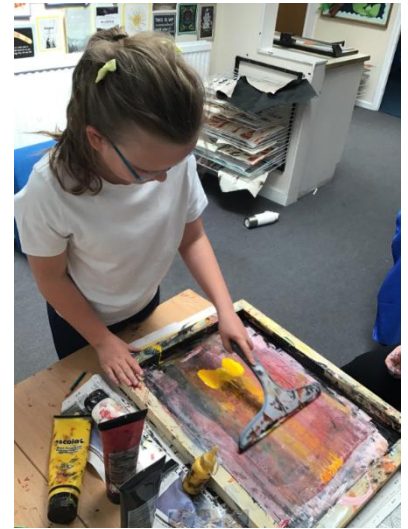
